Box 1803, Santa Cruz, Calif. 95061. All poems selected for publication are also entered in the APA's Poetry Contest, which awards more than \$11,000 in prizes to 152 winners.

Ushers were Sandy Needham of Charlotte, Don Crater and Bruce Everhart of Winston-Salem.

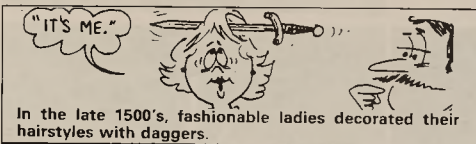

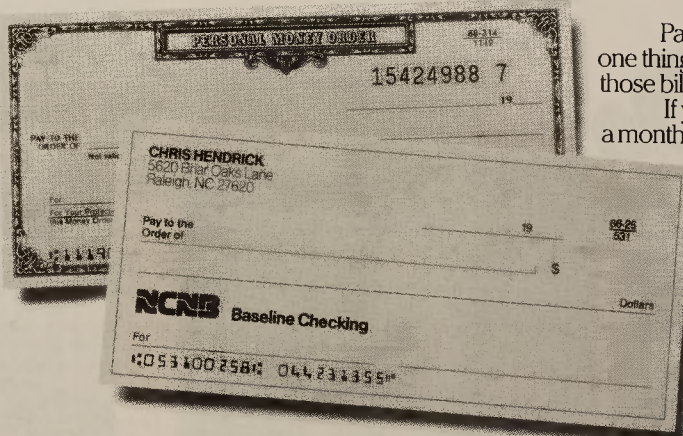
