The dedication program was part of the church's centennial celebration, which will conclude Sunday.

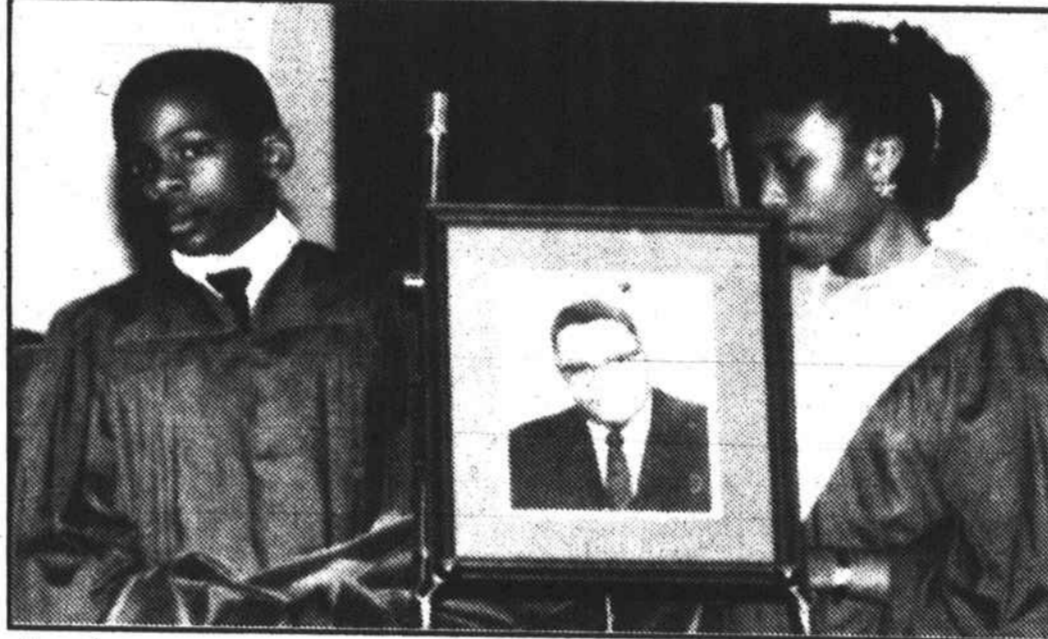

Open Door Apostolic Church of Christ was organized in 1942, by Bishop Joseph and Mother C.L. Acker. A church mission was opened on 1101 Hamlin Gashton St., and the membership consisted of nine members.

The name, Open Door Apostolic Church of Christ, received the name as the result of a vision from the Lord. The word was preached by Peter on the day of

Pentecost: The door was opened and it has been opened since. The Church was chartered in 1964 and a larger edifice was purchased on 610 Smith St. as the membership continued to grow.

In 1971, Pastor C.L. Acker cared for her husband as his health failed. The membership decreased after Bishop J. Acker's death in 1973.

Mrs. Acker continued the work. In 1976, the church was sold and the members scattered. In June 1981, open door was reopened at its location, 922 Alder St.

Mrs. Acker asked Bishop Lawrence S. Tate, pastor and founder of New Faith Chapel Holiness Church, to serve as executive bishop of Open Door Apostolic Church and the two merged in service and joined together in fellowship.

Mrs. Acker's health failed and during her illness, she lost both of her legs. Dr. Lawrence S. Tate, the executive bishop, appointed Elder Tony D. Williams in April 1988 as co-pastor.

Elder Williams was given the duty to keep Open Door in operation, as well as build up the membership. He said his main objective is to be a blessing to the Happy Hill Garden Community. Elder Williams served as ruling elder of the New Faith Chapel Organization from 1987-1988, until he was elevated as the organization's overseer.
