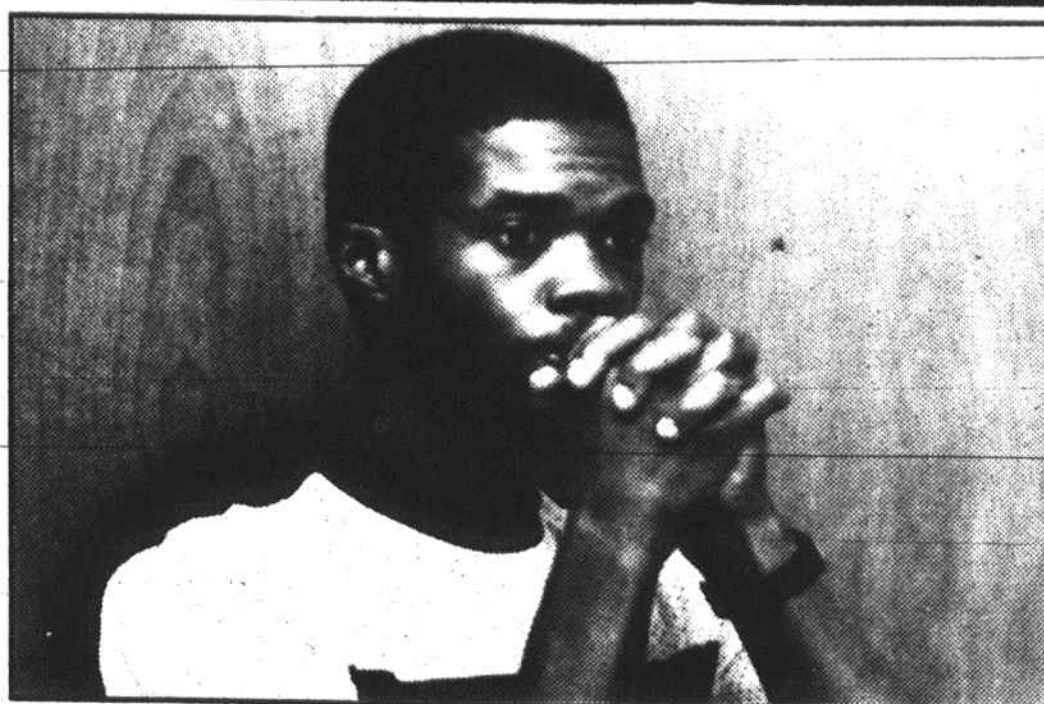
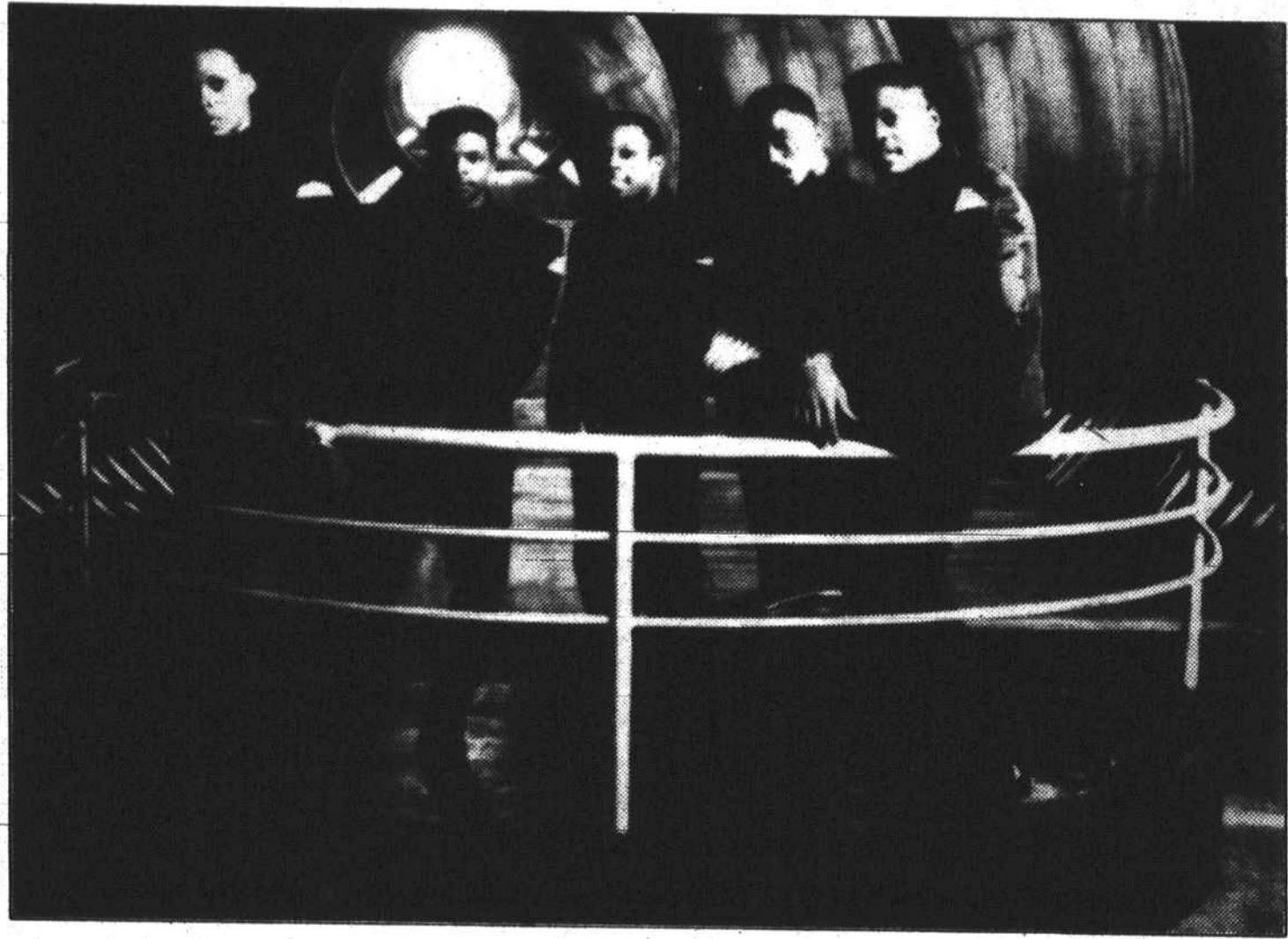

When one thinks of talented Afro-Americans, undoubtedly the names of famous musicians are recalled. Music has been a major component of our cultural heritage. Rhythmic sounds were used to transmit messages from village to village in Africa, to carry news and information from plantation to plantation in America, to tell a story of joy during the '20s, and generally to provide comfort, and to rejoice. Our people have originated several music forms -- jazz, blues, gospel, ragtime, spirituals -- and have achieved in every musical arena from rhythm and blues to opera. Every Monday at the Delta Arts Center our musical contributions

will be spotlighted. The sounds of various artists, composers or music styles will be available for your listening pleasure. The Center's hours, during July, are 10 am. to 6 p.m. Monday through Friday and noon to 4 p.m. on Saturday.
