Classes will begin Tuesday, June 11 and continue each Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday until July

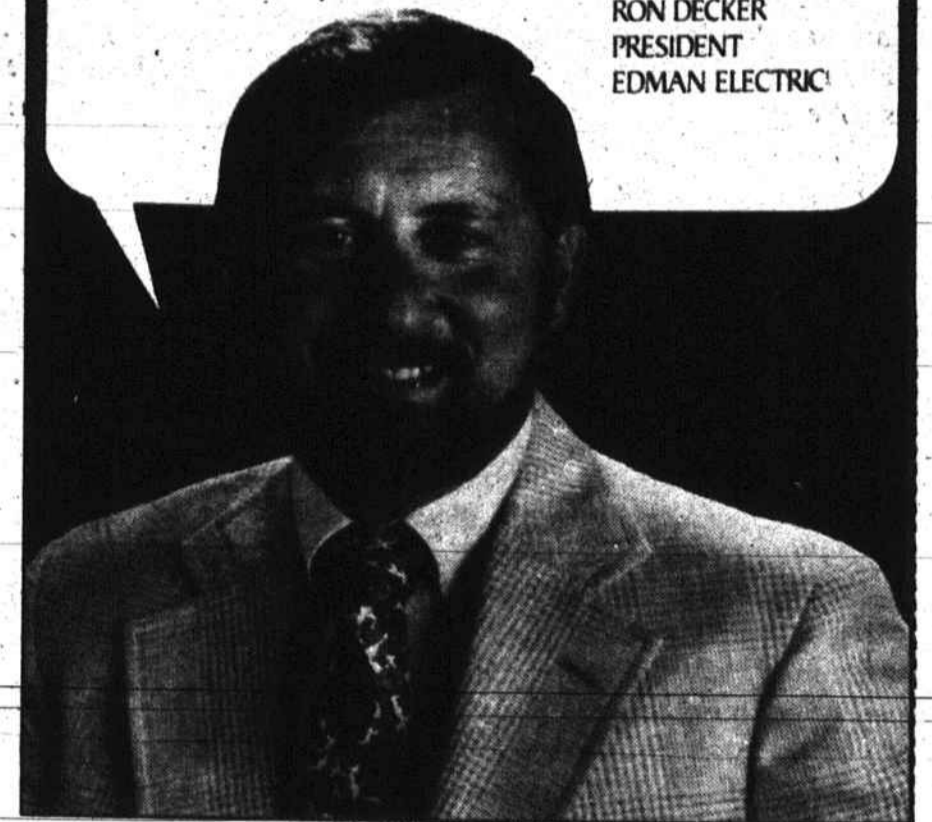
25th from 6 p.m. to 7 p.m. Classes will not be held the week of July 4th.
