- To receive a free reference guild listing the organizations that can give you answers to your questions about Medicare coverage, billing issues, supplemental insurance, lost Medicare cards, peer review, etc., write to Medical Review of North Carolina, P.O. Box 37309, Raleigh, N.C. 27627 or call 1-800-682-2650.
- Writers fellowships, nonfiction writers project grants and a residency in La Napoule, France are available from the N.C. Arts Council. Interested writers must apply to the literature section by Feb. 1, 1992. To be eligible for any of these programs, an applicant must have lived in N.C. for the past year. Writers may not use monies from these programs for educational expenses and those pursuing undergraduate and graduate degrees are ineligible for the grants. For more information, contact Debbie McGill, Literature Director, N.C. Arts Council, Department of Cultural Resources, Raleigh, N.C. 27601-2807, or call 733-2111.
- State playwrights who have made career commitments to their art are eligible for N.C. Arts Council fellowships. Interested playwrights must apply by Feb. 1, 1992. Usually totaling \$8,000 each, playwright fellowships provide direct support to artists so they may put aside time to work. The awards also enable a playwright to purchase supplies and equipment, achieve career goals, and devote full attention to writing plays. To be considered for a fellowship, an applicant must have lived in N.C. for one year prior to applying for the award. Anyone enrolled in a degree-granting academic program is ineligible, and the Council stipulates that no fellowship grant monies be used for educational expenses. For more information, contact George Parides, Theatre Arts Director, N.C. Arts Council, Department of Cultural Resources, Raleigh, N.C. 27601-2807, or call 733-2821.
- Composer fellowships are available to any N.C. composer who has made significant contributions to music composition. Interested composers must apply by Feb. 1, 1992. Composer fellowships usually total \$8,000. Interested applicants must have resided in N.C. for at least one year. Recipients may not use these monies for educational expenses, and composers pursuing graduate or undergraduate degrees are ineligible. For more information, contact Peter MacBeth, Music Director, N.C. Arts Council, Department of Cultural Resources, Raleigh, N.C. 27601-2807, or call 733-2821.
- Jazz composer fellowships are available from the N.C. Arts Council. Interested persons must apply by Feb. 1, 1992. Any N.C. jazz composer who has lived in the state at least one year and made substantial contributions to jazz contribution over the past five years may apply. Anyone enrolled in a degree-granting academic program is ineligible, and recipients cannot use the monies for educational expenses. For more information, contact Peter MacBeth, Music Director, N.C. Arts Council, Department of Cultural Resources, Raleigh, N.C. 27601-2807, or call 733-2821.
