Tickets may also be purchased at the North Carolina Black Repertory Company Office, at the Arts Council Theatre, 610 Coliseum Dr., Monday through Friday from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Tickets can be purchased at the door immediately prior to the performance, although it should be advised that because of the tremendous audience response and critical acclaim "Zora" earned during its run in the festival, playing to SRO crowds, early reservations are strongly suggested.
