Through the efforts of the Junior League of Winston-Salem and with a great deal of assistance from the Parks and Recreation Department and Public Libraries, the Cartwheels program will be run on an entirely volunteer basis.

Taking place every Tuesday and Thursday of the week during July and August, the program

offers a taste of being creative to children and their parents, and a chance to enjoy the activity close to home. Classes for this summer's program will include arts and crafts for the younger children, working with clay, creating jewelry out of fiber, paper and beads, and drawing.

Classes will begin at 6 p.m. and all classes will run simultaneously. Pre-registration is required at the locations scheduled. Because space is limited, children should be registered as soon as possible. To register, contact the site closest to you.

Evenings in the Neighborhoods provides an opportunity for families to attend performing arts happenings in their own "backyards" and serves as an avenue for local performers to showcase their talent.

This concert series will bring music and entertainment to 16 sites throughout the country every Monday and Wednesday during July and August beginning at 7 p.m.

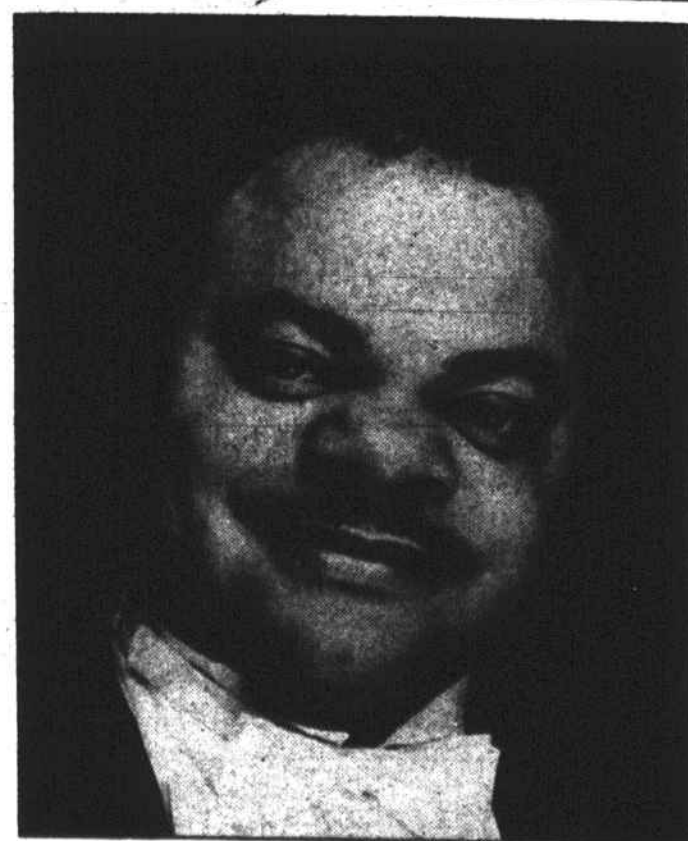
