Charlie says WSSU gave him "a sense of direction. State provided an excellent foundation for being able to effectively work with young people."

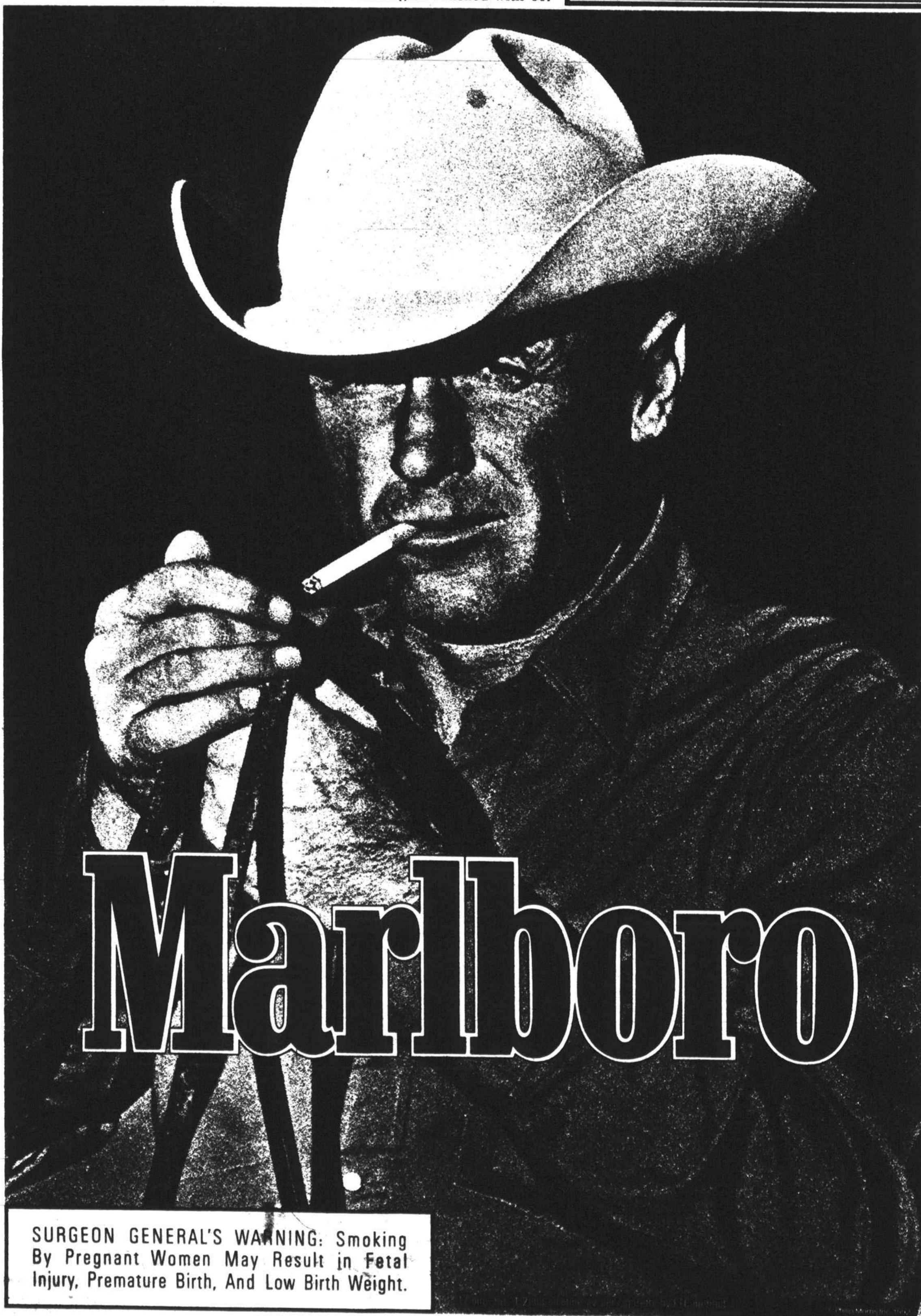
