

Questions & Answers on recovering from grief *

Questions asked during bereavement courseling are answered by the editor of Afterloss, the grief recovery letter.

Q. My neighbor's wife died recently. I want to help him but I don't know what to say.

A. Friends often avoid the subject of the deceased because they fear. creating an emotional reaction in the one who is grieving. More often that not, mentioning the loss is a real sign of caring. It can be comforting to the griever and. afford him the opportunity to express some genuine feelings. Try relating a light or joyful time you remember personally. It helps to open the conversation and signals the survivor that you are available to listen and support.


