The ABCD Infant/Toddler Stimulation Program, located on the pediatrics floor of Reynolds Health Center, is recipient of a \$10,000 grant to broaden and expand services to disadvantaged, high-risk infants, toddlers, and their families who come to Reynolds Health Center for health care and parenting education.

The program also provides training and supervision of peer counselors who assist other mothers and provide parenting information in the pediatrics clinics.
