Lee Cox Joins National Black Theatre Festival Staff

Winston-Salem artist, writer and businessman Lee Cox has joined the staff of the 1993 National Black Theatre Festival as Public Relations Director and Special Assistant to the Producer, Larry Leon Hamlin. The Festival will take place in Winston-Salem on August 2-7.

"We are fortunate to have Mr. Cox join us," said Hamlin. "He is tied into a broad segment of our community. He brings a solid

background in media relations and community activism." During his career, Cox has held positions in radio and television around the country. He and his wife, Martha, owned and operated two frame shops and galleries and a wholesale framing business in Winston-Salem. Since 1991, after selling the business, Cox has devoted full-time to screenwriting.

He is in search of a Hollywood pro-

ducer to turn one of their screenplays into a feature film.

Lee Cox said that the Festival is a unique opportunity for our community. "I want to see the Festival grow and make its mark in history as we put Winston-Salem on the international theatre map," said Cox.

Mr Cox is affiliated with several community, arts and civic groups including the Associated Artists of Winston-Salem, the

Arts Council of Winston-Salem and Forsyth County, The Unitarian Universalist Fellowship of Winston-Salem, The Citizens United for Justice and other advocacy groups.

Cox instructs at the Young Yu School of Tae Kwon Do where he holds a third-degree black belt in Moo Duck Kwon.

Cox spends what is left of his time reading, writing, painting and camping.
