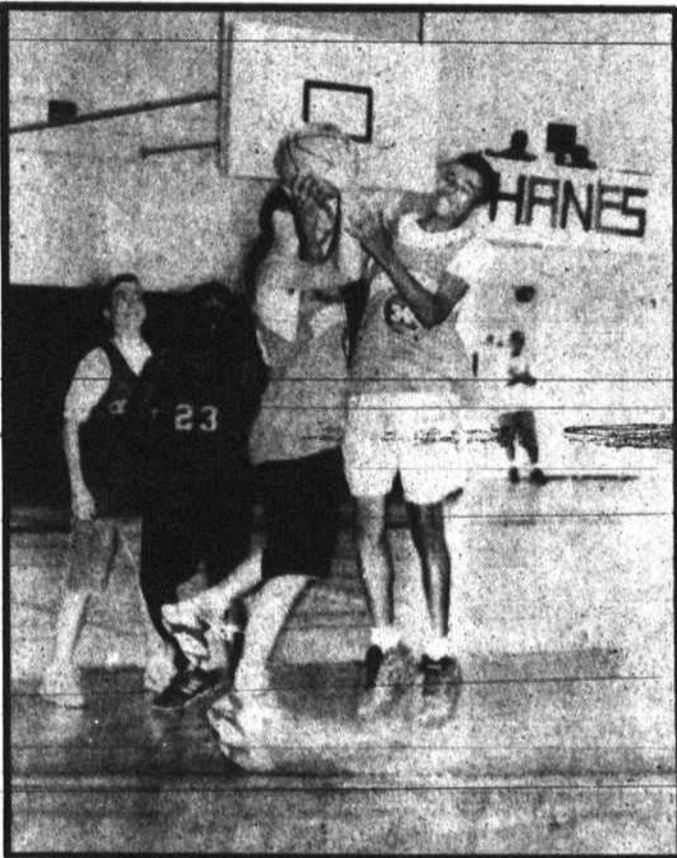

The Hornets were led by James Moore, Chris Blackwell, Akili Marshall, Quann Richardson, Cory Caldwell and Jordan Lash.

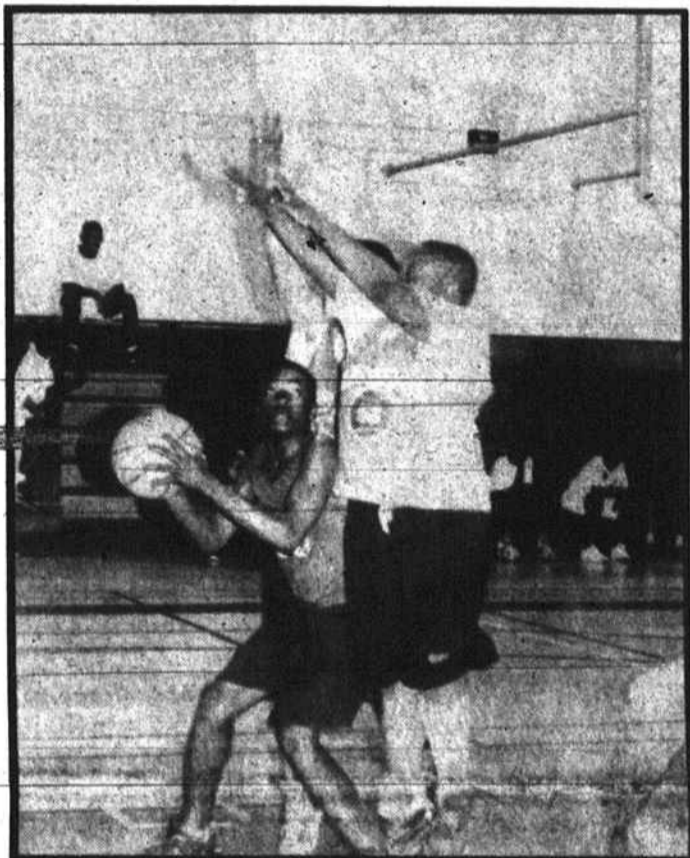

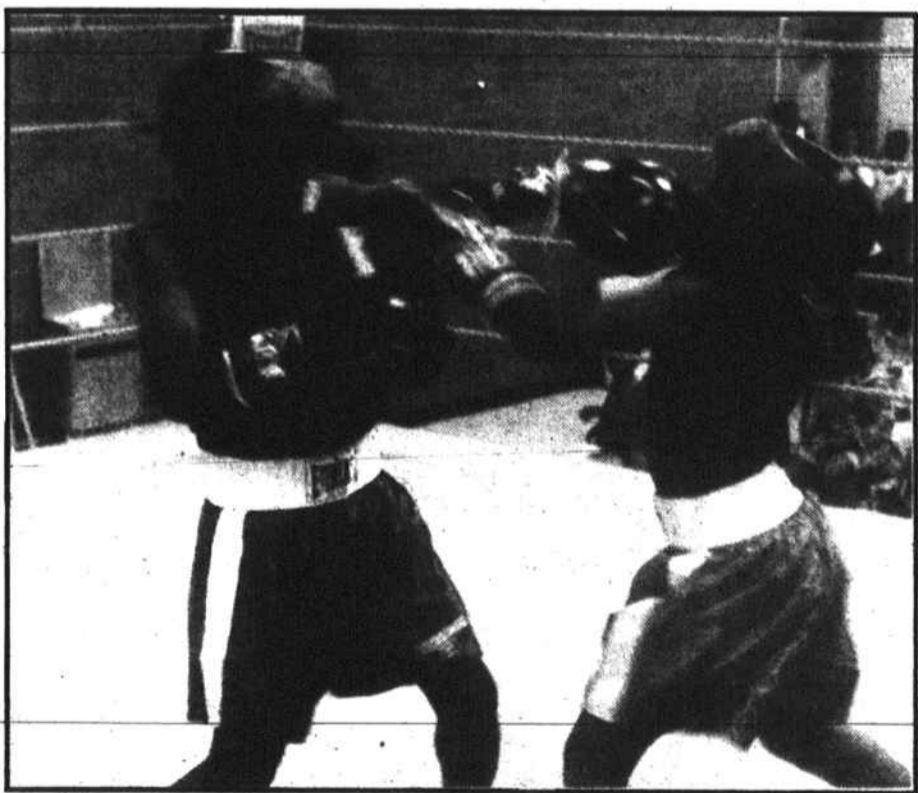
It's powerful defense that blocks this player from the net.

Barry Washington was also hot on the floor, as he scored 20 points for the North Boys.

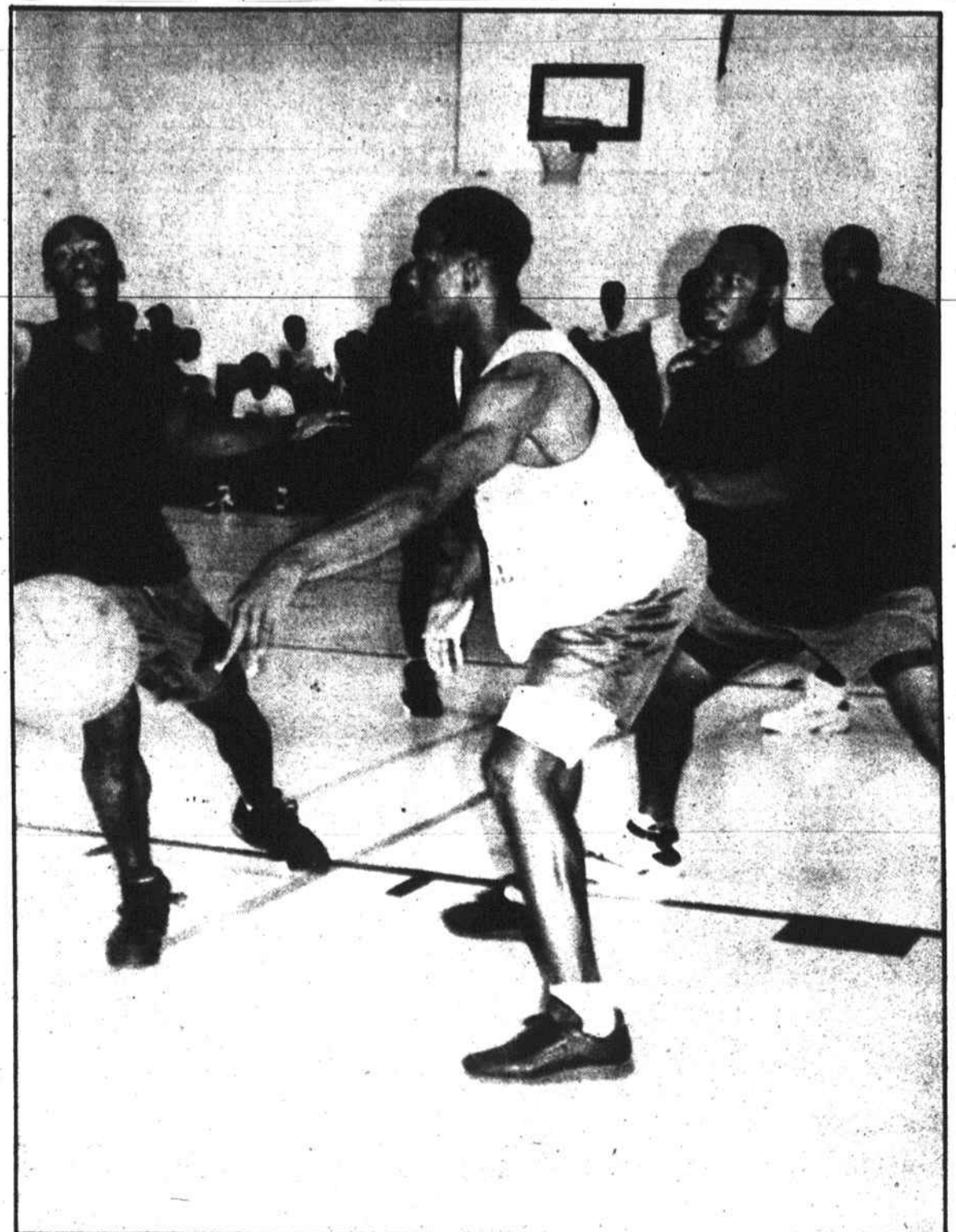
The final game of the evening was consid-

ered by fans the most exciting of all. It was a game not intended for fans with faint hearts, as State Farm defeated Nubian 56-55.

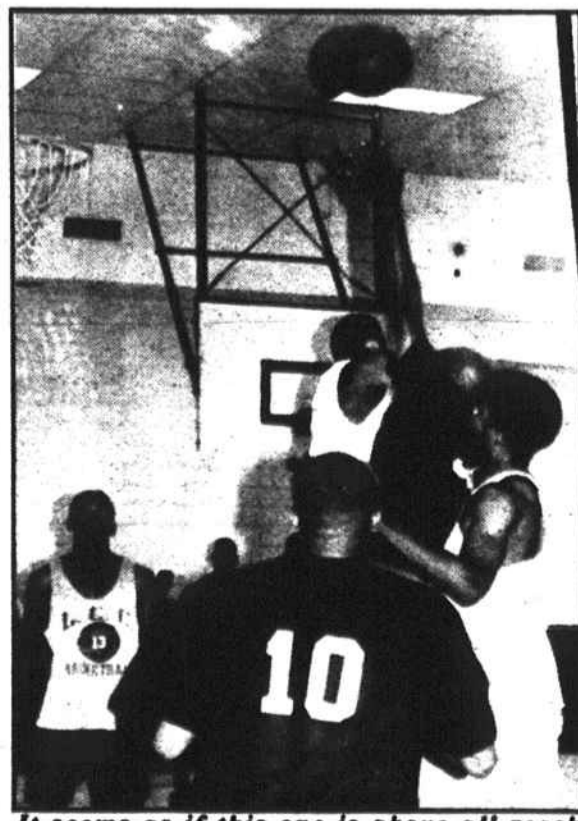
Nubian took the lead by two points with 10 seconds left on the clock, but Tim Wilborn
