In the 13-year-old division, Twin City lost in the first game of competition to East Rowan by a wipe-out score



All-Star teams featuring many of the premier rising high school seniors in the country will be taking part in a week-long competition in the coliseum and its annex. In addition, a number of activities are planned surrounding the tournament to provide entertainment and education for basketball fans of all ages.

More than 55 teams are expected to participate in the championships. Teams are divided and compete in "pools" for three days. The Championship Bracket Play and Tarheel Shootout Tournament begin July 21, with the

Glenn High School is in sixth place tied with Forsyth Country Day School. Both schools hold a one and two record.


Darrell Johnson is terror on the floor, scoring 18 points a game for Glenn and recovering 12 rebounds. Mike Chambers averages 15 points
