The kids said they got help with improving their math skills and reading skills.

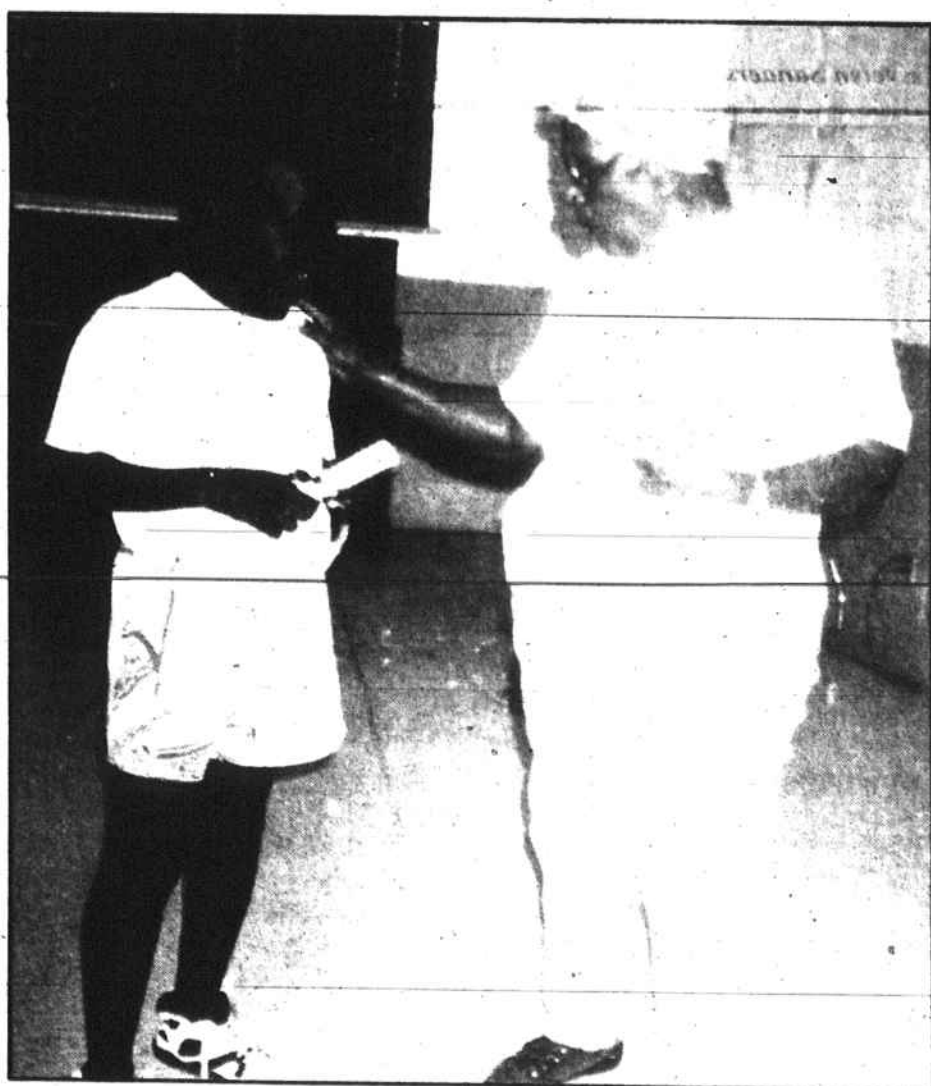
After the discussion period a video was shown.
