Geno Segers, a graduate of East orsyth High School and Western arolina University, is now a memer of the world-renown American atriot Rugby Team.

Segers was coached in high chool football by Perry Pearson nd won All-Conference and Alltate. "I believe my most memoable game was my junior year hen we played against Page (High chool). It was a close game even hough the score didn't show it. We tayed close to them until the end of

the game when they scored two touchdowns on our fumbles," Segers said.

He was also a two-time state champion in wrestling at East Forsyth.

While attending Western Carolina in Sylva, Segers took All-Conference his sophomore, junior and senior year. He also led the nation in defensive ends with the most tackles, with 110 in one season.

I was small, but I had a high level of endurance. The game I will always remember there was when we played East Tennessee, it was my first and only nationally-aired game on ESPN. Our coach, Bob Waters, was dying from Parkinson's disease, and the game was a tribute to him, which we won 34-24,'

Rugby is a sport played all over the world, but it is not as well

known in America. America does have Union Rugby. The capital of rugby is Austria. Rugby is a sophisticated form of football with no blocks, no punts, no forward passing and no time outs.

There are 40-minute halfs and 80-minute matches which, according to Segers, requires more endurance. Thirteen players are on a team, and only four substitutions in each game are allowed.

The American version of Union Rugby is different than regular league rugby. In America you can have 15 players, and there are breaks in play.

"I got into rugby because I was

nable to get into the NFL after playing at Western for four years. The NFL said I was too small as a defensive end at about 225-230 pounds. So I played two tryout games in New York and was picked for the No. 10 position, with only 18 players being chosen including substitutions," Segers said.

The United States hosted its first game when Canada played in New York in August, with America winning 54-14. Their next game will be in Canada on Oct 17. The team will have three tours this season including Austria and Africa.

The international league is a little different than seasonal sports, because they are set-up games. If you get good enough you can play
