Questions & Answers on recovering from grief *

Questions asked during bereavement counseling are answered by the editor of Afterloss, the grief-recovery letter. Q. My sister (whom I have al-ways considered very stable and sensible) is having a difficult time after her loss and seems to be suffering so. I wonder if that isn't psychosomatic?

A. Grief has a purpose and a healing function. Sometimes the pain appears to be intolerable for some individuals. Most specialists will agree that the acute process cannot proceed and reach completion without some degree of suffering. Be certain that your sister has someone to listen to her expressions of pain and encourage her to keep busy and useful. The period of acuity usually passes quickly.
