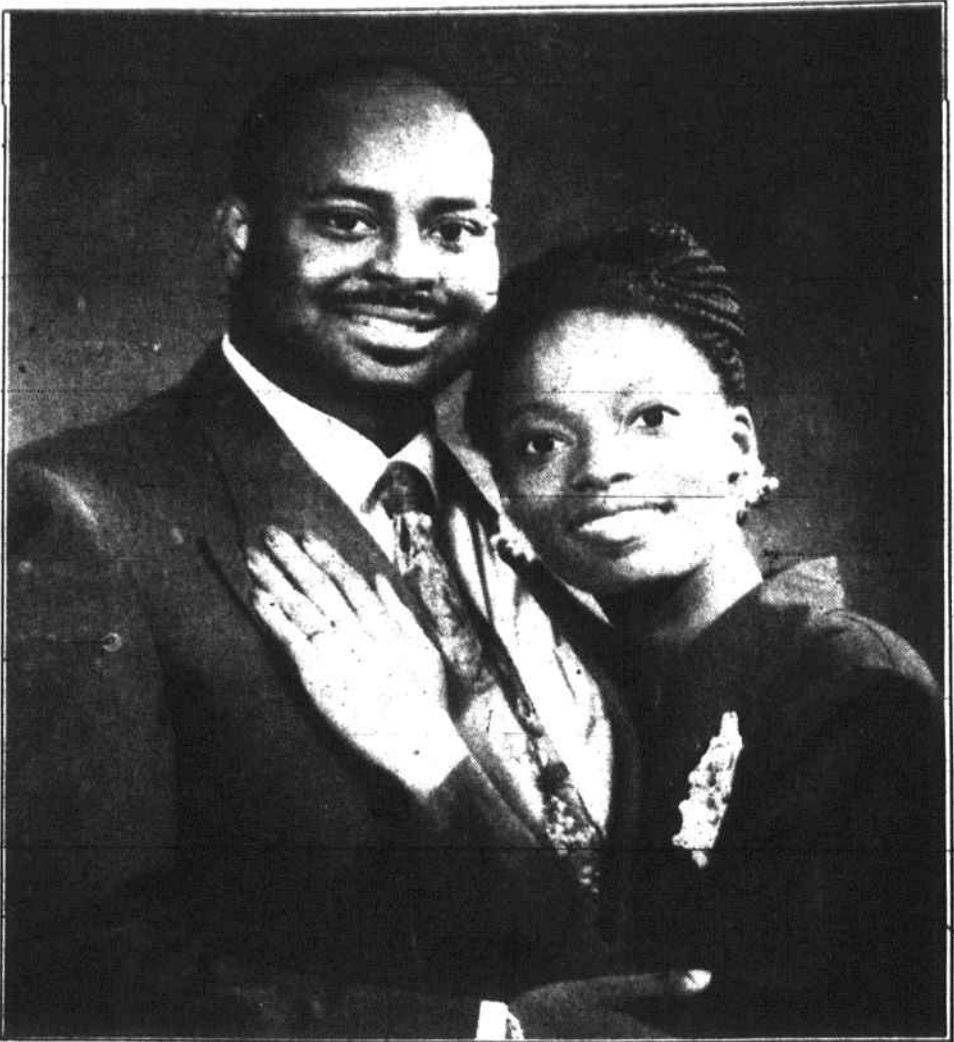
Yarbrough and Churn
