

Voices Of Triumph Author, Rosalyn Andrews To Hold Book Signing Saturday at Special Occasions

Rosalyn McPherson Andrews, vice president of marketing for Time-Life's education division, will visit the city Saturday to promote the book "Leadership," the second volume of Time-Life Books's three-part series entitled "African Americans: Voices of Triumph."

Many books chronicling the achievements of African Americans are already on the market, but Andrews said this project uncovers many previously unknown facts.

There are a lot of unsung heroes in this series and a lot of pictures that previously have not been shown," she said.

Its reading is also more like a story format. It will definitely be used for research, but we look at it like a family series because it's accessible to a broader age range," she said.

The three books in the series, "Perseverance," "Leadership," and "Creative Fire," were authored by Roxie France-Nuriddin, Cynthia Richardson and Myrna Taylor-Herndon, three African-American Time-Life women employees.

"Perseverance" was published last October and the third volume, "Creative Fire," is scheduled to be released in June.

Andrews, 41, oversees the project and selected the writers and the advisory board for the project.

Working in publishing for a

long time, I've always dreamed of doing something like this," she said. "It's a mammoth task that was done in a short time."
