'Save Our Youth' Benefit Concert to be Held Tuesday

A free concert for the benefit of the city's youths will be held at 7:30 p.m. on April 8 at the Lawrence Joel Veterans Memorial Coliseum.

The concert, sponsored by Save Our Youth - Crusade 2000, an organization of several groups of outreach youth ministry workers, will feature renowned gospel saxophonist Venard Johnson.

The concert will also feature a citywide youth mass choir under the direction of David Allen.

"We just want to reach out to them (youths)," said Cheryl Harry, a member of the concert steering committee. "We want to reach out to children who don't traditionally go to church.'

In a letter sent to ministers, city officials and other concerned citizens in January, members of the Save Our Youth organization said that "our city is in serious trouble. There are gangs everywhere, driveby shootings are increasing every

day, drugs and crime are taking over the city, rapes are happening in the schools and on school buses, suicides are increasing and violence is everywhere you look."

Johnson is credited with popularizing the saxophone in churches throughout the world. Currently living in Ft. Worth, Texas, Johnson is also credited with "winning the lost for Christ" through his music. He has performed before highranking officials throughout the world and has appeared with such personalities as Billy Graham, Ben Vareen and former presidents Ronald Reagan and George Bush.

. Johnson earned a bachelor's degree in music education from Kansas State Teachers College, a master's degree in church music from Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary and, from the same institute, a doctorate of musical arts.




