Questions & Answers on recovering from grief *

Questions asked during bereavement counseling are answered by the editor of *Afterloss*, the grief-recovery letter.

Q. Since my husband died about four weeks ago, I've noticed a "weak feeling." I had a check-up with my doctor and he says I'm fine. Is this normal?

A. Yes. There are several somatic symptoms that are common to people who grieve. A feeling of muscle weakness is one of them. Others include tightness in the throat and chest, a need for sighing, an empty feeling in the abdomen and a sense of numbness. As your bereavement progresses you will find this weakness less noticeable. It will disappear as you feel more in control of your life.
