Hampton Men - Tabbed CIAA's Best

Hampton University captured the C.H. Williams Award, indicative of the CIAA's Men's All-Sport Championship. In capturing this year's award, the Hampton men's program has won the CIAA All-Sports title four consecutive years.

The award was presented to Hampton University Thursday at the CIAA Award Luncheon held at the Holiday Inn-Coliseum in Hampton, Va.

Hampton accumulated 185.5 points edging out rival Norfolk State which garnered 177.0 points during the 1993-94 athletic year. The same schools repeated their one-two finish of the last year. Johnson C. Smith repeated third place finish in 1993 and N.C. Central finished fourth, jumping from eighth place last year.

Fayetteville State made the biggest improvement in the men's all-sports category as the Broncos finished in eighth place, up from thirteenth a year ago.

Schools (teams) are awarded points determined by their finish in the CIAA conference sponsored championship or their respective sports. Points are awarded on a descending basis as determined by their relative finish to the number of teams participating in that particular sport (i.e., 11-football, 14-basketball).

Keith Smith of Shaw University was named Athletic Director of the Year. Greg Goings of Virginia State University was named Sport Information Director of the Year and Norfolk State was awarded the Jeanette Lee Athletic Achievement Award for outstanding athletic administration for the year. Al Myatt of the *Raleigh News*

and Observer was named CIAA Sportswriter of the Year.

The C.H. Williams Men's All-Sports Championship award is named in honor of Charles Holston Williams, one of the co-founders of the CIAA, and served in every CIAA Executive Administrative position. He was 1909 graduate of Hampton Institute starring in baseball while in college. As a coach at HI he won CIAA championship in football, baseball and wrestling. He served as the HI athletic director until his retirement in 1951. He died November 9, 1978.

Norfolk State Wins Loretta Taylor Award

Norfolk State University has claimed the 1993-94 Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association All Sport Championship in women's sports.

The awards were announced at the CIAA Awards Luncheon held at the Holiday Inn-Coliseum in Hampton, Va.

Norfolk State University unseated St. Augustine's College,

which had won the Loretta Taylor Award for the CIAA Women's All Sports Championship for the past two years.

The Spartanette program was named the victor with 121.0 points to edge out St. Augustine's (117.0) and Hampton (109.0).

Schools (teams) are awarded points determined by their finish in

the CIAA conference sponsored championship in their respective sports.

Points are awarded on descending basis as determined by their finish relative to the number of teams participating in that particular sport (i.e. 14 - Basketball, 11 - Softball).

Making a statement this year was Fayetteville State University

which came from 12th place last year and moved into 6th place with 77.5 points.

Virginia State University's 75.00 points placed them in 7th place this year, moving up from 10th place last year.

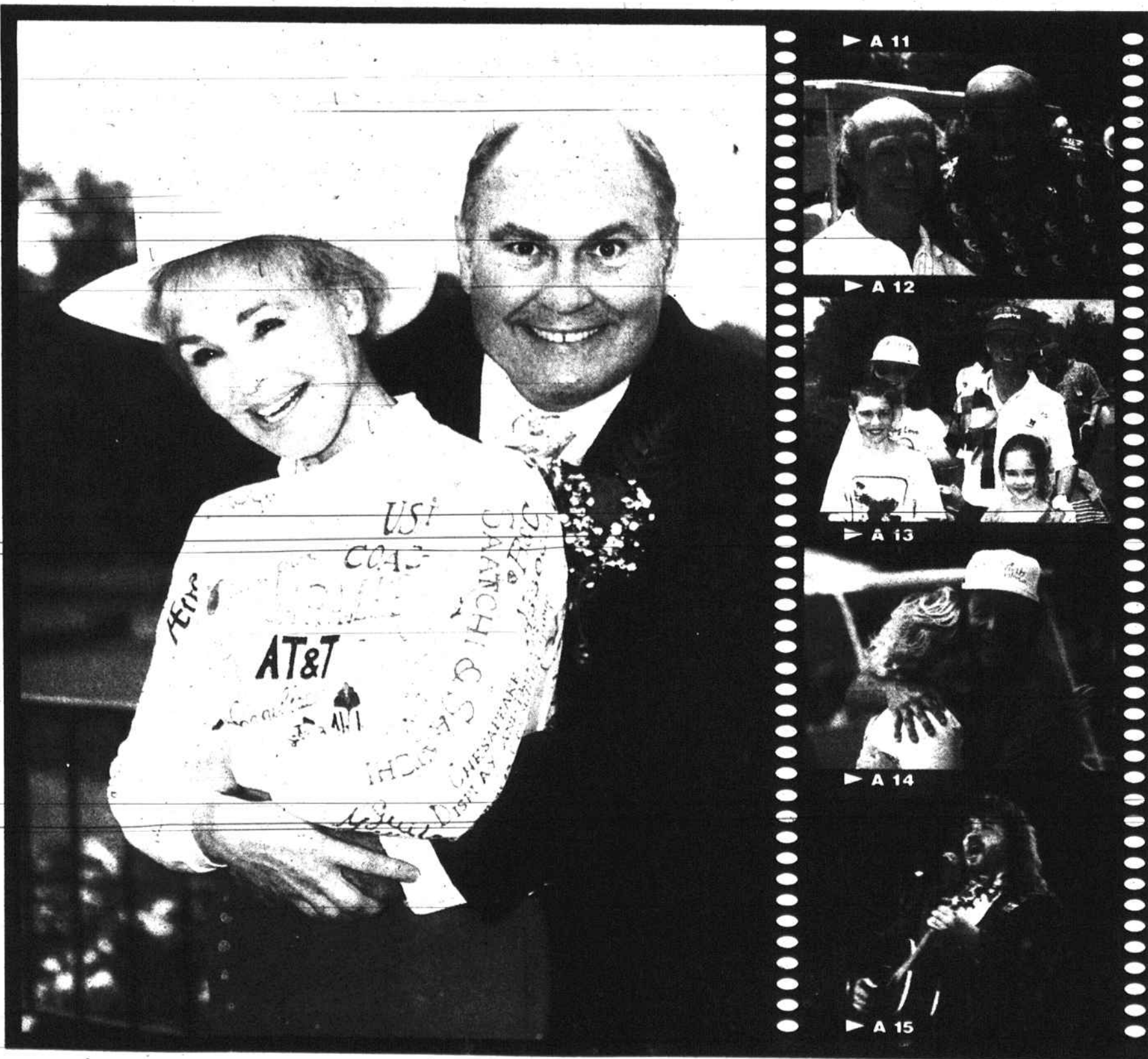
MAP POSTING.

South Sector of Winston-Salem
The City-County Planning Board of Forsyth County and Winston-Salem recommended for approval to the elected boards on March 11, 1993, the text of the UNIFIED DEVELOPMENT ORDINANCES. These new development regulations will create new zoning districts, setbacks, minimum lot sizes, permitted uses, use conditions, and other revised requirements. The Official Zoning Maps for Forsyth County, Winston-Salem, Clemmons, and Kernersville must be changed in conjunction with the text of the new Zoning Ordinance to replace existing zoning districts with new comparable zoning districts for all property in these jurisdictions. There will be public informational drop-in sessions for Forsyth County, Winston-Salem, Clemmons, and Kernersville by sectors. All property owners as recorded in the Forsyth County tax listings in the South Sector of Winston-Salem (shaded area on map) have been mailed a Notification of Zoning District Map Conversion Hearings.
