

Senior Service operates the community's Meal on Wheels program, provides adult day care services, conduct assessments leading to personalized health care plans for individuals, provides-in-home personal care and acts as information and referral agents for the elderly.



The combined Post and Auxiliaries also worshiped together at St. Matthews Apolositic Church on Sunday.




