More than 5,000 people are expected to attend the 90th Annual General Assembly and Church Growth Conference August 8th - 12th at the M.C. Benton Convention Center. Sponsored by the Church of God Apostolic, the conference, hosted by the Rev. and Mrs. J.C. Hash and the St. Peter's World Outreach Center, will feature internationally known speakers, musical artists, workshops, children's and youth crusades, and a 100-voice choir.

Hash, pastor of St. Peter's, said the conference is a time of spiritual refreshment for the 4,500 members of the churches in the COGA, who will come from the United States and abroad.

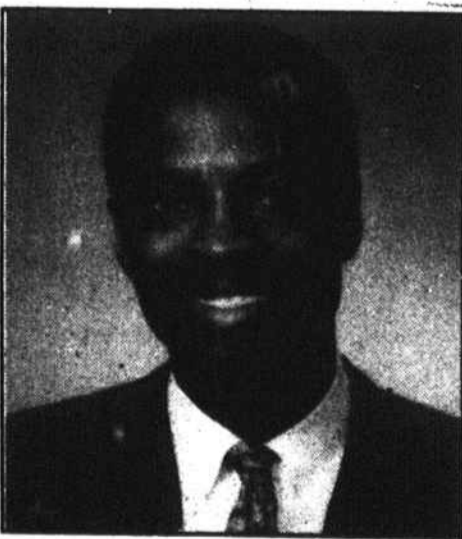

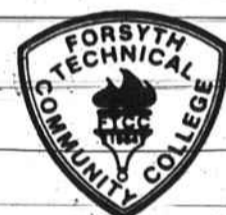

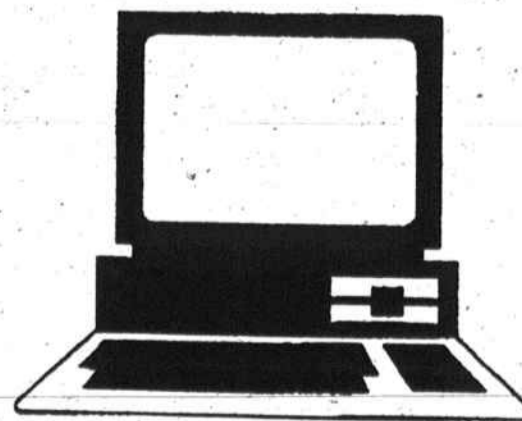
