Anderson Science Cash Award (\$250.00) which is given annually at the high school. She has a 3.8 grade point average and is the daughter of Mr. & Mrs. Joyce & Edward Irby. In addition to the afore mentioned win, she also won 1st place at the District Level; Forsyth County, and 1st place at the North Carolina Region Five Science Fair; Stokes, Rockingham, Caswell, Person, Orange, Alamance, Guilford, Forsyth, Davidson, Randolph, and Chatham.

At the District Level Davidson received a 1st place ribbon and a plaque. At the Regional Level the recipient received a plaque, a \$40 cash award, a Sci-Works Family membership, a graphic calculator and a chance to win an \$8,000 cash scholarship provided her entry (science project) is one of the top twenty five selected. 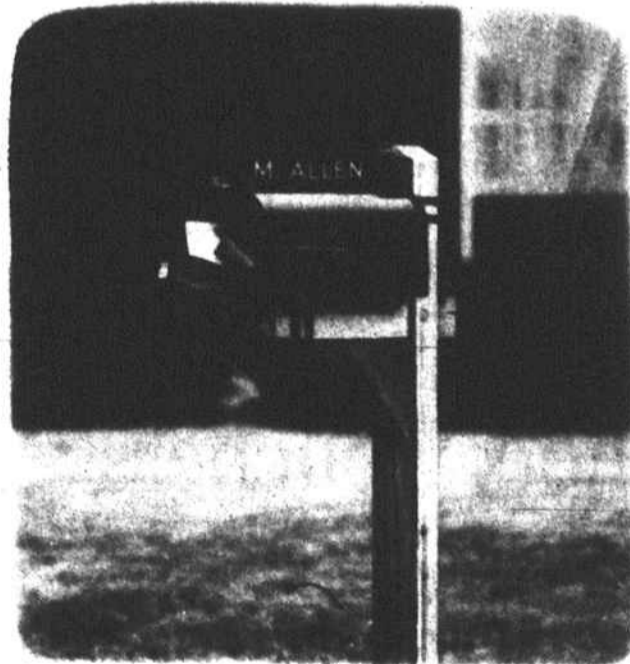
