Series tickets are on sale now at the Symphony box office, 610 Coliseum Drive, 723-7919.

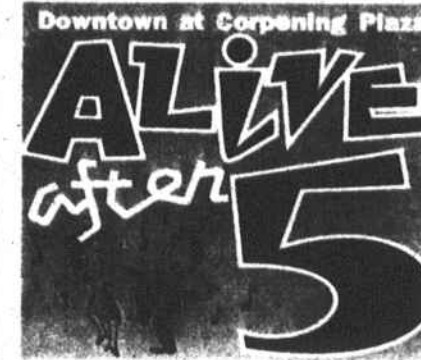
