# -Virginia State Wins Battle of Top CIAA Teams

Virginia State crushed Elizabeth City State 44-3 Oct. 21 in a battle of league-leaders in the CIAA conference football race to remain atop the conference standings.

The game at Petersburg, Va. saw Vir-CIAA Review ginia State run its record to 6-0 in the CIAA and 7-1 overall, while ECSU fell to 6-2 in the league and overall.

Quarterback Rodney Granger led the Virginia State aerial attack, passing for 176 yards and two touchdowns, and running for 46. Bo Morgan led the ground assault with 125 yards and two touchdowns and Samuel Harrell added two rushing touchdowns.

The Trojans held ECSU to 110 yards on the ground with Malcolm Mackey netting 59 yards on three carries. The Vikings only score came on a 27-yard field goal by Wilton Evans in the first quarter.

Norfolk State defeated Virginia Union 58-32 in the annual Gold Bowl in Richmond as Spartan quarterback Aaron Sparrow had his fourth 400plus yard passing game of the season, throwing for 450 yards on 32 completions and six touchdowns. CIAA receiver of the week James Roe was on the receiving end of eight passes for 104 yards and three touchdowns.

Norfolk held Virginia Union to 15 yards rushing, forcing the Panthers to rely on quarterback Donald Ruffin, who completed 23 passes for 305 yards. Sunnil Motley and John Green anchored the Spartan defense with eight tackles each, while Veltrellico

Johnson C. Smith registered its first win of the season when it ruined Fayetteville State's homecoming, 14-9. Demertis Campbell ran for 43 yards to lead the Golden Bulls ground game and quarterback De'Trell Calloway completed six passes for 57 yards and a touchdown. Cedric Morgan led the Broncos defense with 17 tackles (10 solo, 7 assisted).

Bowie State recorded a 20-7 victory ove, Winston-Salem State in Maryland. The Bulldogs defense held Richard Huntley, the CIAA's leading rusher, to 52 yards on 17 carries. Ryan Pigford led the Bulldog offense with two touchdowns, while gaining 58 yards on eight carries. Topper Ellis paced the rushing attack with

In non-conference action. Livingstone whipped Knoxville College 49-14 as quarterback Parnell Wilder passed for 131 yards and two touchdowns. Eric Crawford was the game's leading rusher, carrying 20 times for 98 yards.

In another non-conference game, North Carolina Central lost to Central State of Ohio, 50-30, as the Eagles managed three yards rushing yards.

Duran McLaurin completed 22 passes for 273 yards for NCCU and James Grant was the leading tackler with 16 (7 solo, 9 assisted) to earn CIAA defensive lineman of the week honors.




