Pitts to Preach at Wake Forest

The Progressive National Baptist Convention is a 2.5 million member African-American organization that held its national convention in Charlotte in August. Their relationship has included building a Habitat for Humanity house, a joint youth summer mission trip to Georgia, racial discussion meeting, and a number of joint worship services and pulpit exchanges.

In April the two congregations received the local United Way's Community Problem-Solving Award for their efforts to improve racial understanding.

Rev. Dr. Pitts, before moving to his current post, was Director of Racial Justice, Division of Church and Society, for the National Council of Churches of Christ in the USA. He continues to serve on the National Council of Churches' general board, executive coordinating committee and national mission unit.

He also has been director of an American Baptist Urban Ministry program in Los Angeles, associate pastor at Calvary Baptist Church in Washington, D.C., and serves on boards of a number of national and regional Baptist, Christian and community organizations.

Rev. Dr. Pitts received his undergraduate degree from Vir--ginia State University, his master's of divinity from Colgate Rochester Bexley Hall/Crozier Divinity School and his doctorate from Union Theological Seminary.


