The Nurse educator is a product of the Columbus County Public School System graduating from Mt. Olive High School. She received her BSN from Winston-Salem State University and the MSN from the Medical College of Georgia.

The award winner is employed as a Nursing Instructor at North Carolina Agricultural and Technical State University where she has been since 1991. In addition to teaching Medical Surgical and Fundamentals of Nursing, she serves on several committees and projects. Among her activities are faculty advisor to Dudley Senior High School of Greensboro. She also has represented the School of Nursing for the past four years as one of the faculty representatives to the Joint Clinical Resource Planning Committee which consist of schools of nursing and clinical facilities covering a five-county area. The Faculty member serves on the Academic Resources Committee and Chairs the Admissions and Progression Committee.
