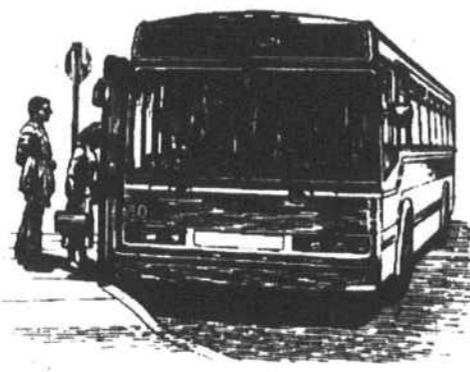
Diggs Galley to Host Three New Shows
