The public is invited. Proceeds will benefit the church's building fund. The host pastor is Dr. B.F. Daniels.

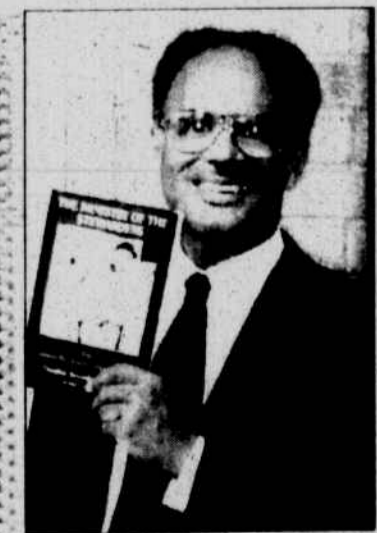
## Brownes announce engagement of daughter

# United Methodist Women present symposium

The United Methodist Women of St. Paul United Methodist Church presented a symposium Oct. 12 at the church.

A symposium is a gathering at which ideas are exchanged and opinions on a subject, or a series of discussions on a given topic are presented.

The topic "Who Shall Care for Us" was chosen by the Social Action Mission chair, Marion B. Simpson, and her team. They were sponsored by the Visionaries, another team of the United Methodist Women, chaired by Clester Hickerson.

Guest panelists included the following people:

- Elleton (Mickey) McCullough is a clinician manager for Forsyth Hospital. McCullough holds a bachelor's degree and a master's in nursing from Winston-Salem State University.

- Attorney Denise Hartsfield is a district attorney for Forsyth County. She received her bachelor's degree in English from Spelman College, a master's from

North Carolina A&T State University and her juris doctorate from Wake Forest University. She is a part-time member of the faculty at the law school there.

- The Rev. Juanita B. Tatum is the assistant pastor at Mt. Moriah Baptist Church in Pinnacle. She is retired as assistant principal of Walkertown Middle School. Currently she is enrolled in the Master of Divinity School at Virginia Union School of Theology. She is also a substitute chaplain at North Carolina Baptist Hospital.

The symposium began at 4 p.m. in the fellowship hall of St. Paul United Methodist Church. A devotional meditation was conducted by Gwen H. Ashley, spiritual growth coordinator. Announcements were made by Bettye Woodborn.

The three groups, led by the three panelists, discussed the movement toward "managed care." The trend is toward more health care facilities becoming community based.

Hartsfield advised the group

to refrain from its fear of the criminal justice system. Women were advised to seek the advise of a lawyer when facing the system before a judge. Woman are being abused, she said. Anyone can find out about such things by visiting the court. She went on to say that the law is not something we need to fear.

Tatum urged members to do the following:

- Be able to come to Christ.
- Accept sanctification and glorification.

- Read the Bible for references to women such as the "woman at the well."

- Pray to learn more about the fatherhood of God.

- Avoid negative thoughts. All of the above will increase spiritual wealth, she said.

Refreshments were enjoyed at the close of the symposium. Doris Hartsfield was in charge. Jimmie Sudler, president of the UMW, gave the benediction. The Rev. Donald Jenkins is pastor.

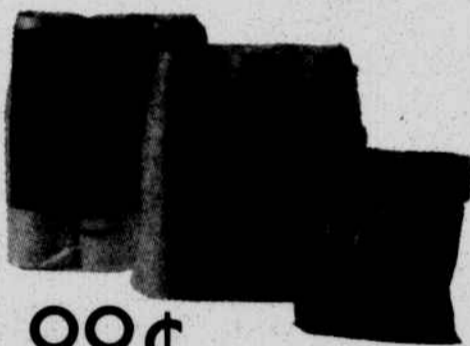
