'Race in America' to explore implications of exhibit

Dr. Gerald Horne will present "Race in America," a lecture focusing on SECCA's current exhibition *Reconstruction: William Christenberry's Art*, including the Klan Room Dec. 4 at 7:30 p.m. The construction of race, particularly "whiteness," its frequent handmaiden "white supremacy," and the political rise of the Ku Klux Klan are central concerns Horne will address. Horne is author of 10 books, including the recently published *Fire This Time: The Watts Uprising and the 1960s*. This program is free and open to the public.

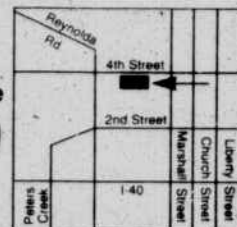
