

Curtis said although only the tournament remains she hasn't given up on the Deacons for this season.

"The season is not over," she said. "We're still looking forward to the tournament. We're probably the best 0-16 team in the country right now.

The key to the Wake program in the future, is improving the caliber of players. Curtis cited Dardy as the type athlete who will help lead the Wake program to prominence.

"Olivia came into the conference with a lot of credentials," she said. "I think she has responded real well. We put her in a position that's not natural for her, but she has been able to expand upon her perimeter game. I think she's going to be a force to be reckoned with."

Dardy was six of 11 from the field, incluing two of three from beyond the 3-point arc. She also grabbed three rebounds and had three steals.

"I think she's one of the top five freshmen in the conference," Curtis said. "You look at what she's done in the ACC and I think that proves she's one of the top five freshmen. There are two or three that stand out above the rest, but I think she's right up there with the rest of them.'


