Hanes Memorial CME will celebrate homecoming

On June 6 former pastor Rev. William S. Fails will deliver a prehomecoming message at 5 p.m. at Hanes Memorial C.M.E. Church. The Missing Man's Choir will accompany Fails and the congregation of First United Baptist Church.

Fails was born in Denver, Colo., in March 1953. He is the third of five children. The son of a soldier, he was educated in the military post school in Fort Leonardwood, Mo.; and the public schools of Fort Smith, Ark., and Leesville, La. In 1966 his family moved to Oklahoma City, Okla., where he graduated from Northeast High School in 1972.

In the fall of 1972, Fails entered Lane College in Jackson, Tenn., and received a B.S. degree in social welfare/sociology with a minor in history in 1976.

Fails was called to preach in 1968, but did not enter the ministry until late 1969. He was licensed to preach in 1969

at Cleaves Memorial C.M.E. Church in Oklahoma City.

While an undergrad, he was pastor at Hope Hill C.M.E. Church at Sitka, Tenn., and Dyer C.M.E. in Dyer, Tenn. Upon graduating from Lane College, he returned to Oklahoma and was pastor at Chandler C.M.E. Church in Chandler, Okla., and Fallis C.M.E. Church in Fallis,

was pastor of Clifford Temple C.M.E. Church in Thomasville, Ga. Fails was then transferred to Washington, D.C. to be pastor of Lane Memorial C.M.E. Church.

In 1986 he was assigned to Hanes Memorial C.M.E. Church in Winston-Salem, where he served until 1989. Then he was transferred to Anderson, S.C., to serve as pastor of Mt. Carmel C.M.E. Church. The next move for Fails was in 1990 to Statesville, where he was pastor at Holsey C.M.E. Church.

In the summer of 1991, Fails was called to be the pastor of First United Baptist Church of High Point, where he currently serves.

Fails is a member of the Ministers Conference of Winston-Salem and Vicinity, the Ministers Conference of High Point, NAACP, Citizens United for Justice, Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity Inc. and Prince Hall Lodge.


