a two-day event. The reunion this year proved to be one of the best and most successful yet. The next reunion will be in Lexington, N.C., in 2003.

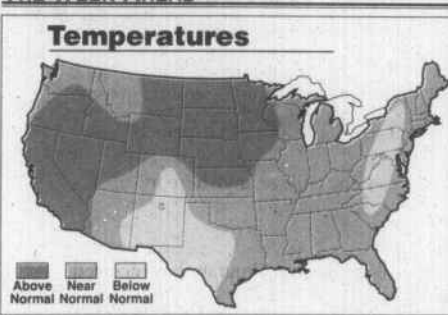
ACCU WEATHER Forecast for Winston-Salem

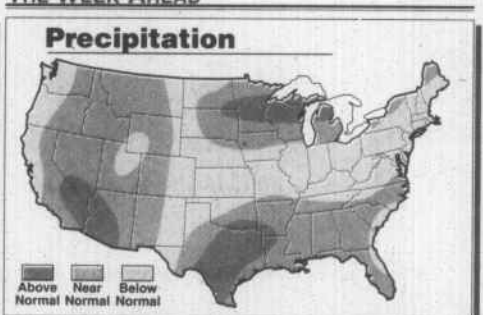
