Green Street Church celebrates its first 100 years

Green Street United Methodist Church in Winston-Salem will continue on "The Way of Shalom," its 100th anniversary celebration, on Sept. 29, with preaching by Bishop Charlene Kammerer and the Rev. Dr. John Mendez.

Rev. Kammerer, bishop of the Charlotte Area, leads the Western North Carolina Conference of the United Methodist Church. Mendez is senior pastor of Emmanuel Baptist Church and president of the Ministers' Conference of Winston-Salem and Vicinity.

The day's events will begin with a prayer service at 8:30 a.m. Activities in a revival tent, dedication of a time capsule, and a half-mile walk to the site of the original church building also will precede the 11 a.m. preaching. An old-fashioned barbecue lunch will be served after the morning worship, and the afternoon activities will

The Green Street Praise Choir and the Emmanuel Baptist Spirituals Choir will sing.

Artist James Williams has painted "The Way of Shalom," an anniversary mural depicting both the vision of the congregation and its debt to others whose influence has been felt in developing the Green Street Church mission: "To connect people to God and each other with a ministry that invites, transforms and serves with

the love of Jesus Christ."

"The Way of Shalom," dedicated on Sept. 24, covers two walls of a courtyard Prayer Garden. For the church's anniversary brochure, Williams also drew sketches of earlier church sites and illustrations of "shalom" references from the biblical book of Isaiah.

"The Way of Shalom" has been the theme of Green Street Church's monthlong recognition of its history and its future. "Shalom," meaning "peace," not only reflects the congregation's origins in the neighborhood just west of the Moravian town of Salem, but also the church's active present-day outreach to its diverse community.

Green Street Church collaborates with nearby churches and neighborhood associations in witness and in social services - with a health ministry, clothing and food closets,
