On Friday, Nov. 21, Members of the Carolina Cruisers Motorcycle Club met and equally divided food for nine families for Thanksgiving. Enough food was provided so that each family will not have to purchase food for at least a week.

The families were identified and selected by appropriate members of the Forsyth County Department of Social Services.

During 2006, the members of the motorcycle club provided food for four families, and six families received food during 2007.

The motorcycle club evolved from a group that enjoyed riding together and subsequently decided to unite and became involved in some type of charity work. The first meeting was held on Aug. 25, 2006, followed by five additional weekly meetings.

Today, the Carolina Motorcycle Club is composed of 46 financial members – 40 males and six females, all of whom are certified. Certification requires skill in operating the motorcycle and completing a required number of rides in a specified period of time.

In addition to providing food to less fortunate families, the club has also co-sponsored the Happy Hill Community Reunion; the Boston Round-Up; Peace Toys For War Toys and contributed to the "Divas Ride For Cancer."
