John Payton, president and director-counsel of the NAACP Legal Defense and Educational Fund, will be the guest speaker for the J. Alston Atkins Constitutional Law Lecture at Winston-Salem State University on Thursday, Oct. 15 at 7:30 p.m. in the Dillard Auditorium of the Anderson Conference Center.

U.S. in recent years, was a partner at the Washington Law firm of Wilmer, Cutler, Pickering, Hale and Dorr prior to joining the Legal Defense and Educational Fund. He was the lead counsel for the University of Michigan in successfully defending the use of race in the admission process, including the undergraduate school argument before the States Supreme United Court.

Payton has taught at the Georgetown Law Center, Howard University Law School and Harvard Law School, where he had earned his law degree in 1977.

The lecture was given by the Rev. Dr. Alton Pollard III, dean and professor of Religion and Culture at Howard University School of Divinity.

Pollard, a former member of the Wake Forest faculty and alumnus of Harvard University Divinity School, delivered his address, "A Defining Moment," based on a Scripture from the Book of Matthew.

he commented. Our nation and world face many challenges, and men and women of God play an important role in the state of our society. Pollard said.
