
The Blessings Project Foundation has announced its list of grant recipients for its fall 2009 grant cycle:



Forsyth County

The North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT), in coordination with the Federal Highway Administration and the Piedmont Research Triad Park, proposes the construction of Research Parkway from Stadium Drive to Third Street in Winston-Salem. The proposed four lane, mediandivided roadway is about 1.7 miles in length extending from Stadium Drive east of Salem Avenue and crossing under I-40 Business to Third Street at Linden Avenue. The proposed project will be constructed on land owned by the Piedmont Triad Research Park following City of Winston-Salem design guidelines. The City will assume ownership of the completed roadway. There are no residential or business relocations. Construction is scheduled to begin in 2010.

In compliance with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), the NCDOT has completed an Environmental Assessment (EA) for the proposed project. This document is available for public review and comment at the following locations.
