The 2009 Atlantic Coast Offensive Conference Player of the Year, Bone has

scored two goals and added 13 assists during his junior season. Bone ranks eighth Plano, Texas, nationally in assists per game and is second in the ACC in helpers. Bone, who was named Top Drawer Soccer's National Player of the Year in 2009, has 38 assists in his career, ranking him second in school history. He also is in the top 10 in school annals in points with 66 career points.

Considered the highest individual honor in college soccer, the recipient of the Hermann Trophy is selected by Division I head coaches who are current members of the NSCAA.
