## Bone could add another soccer honor

Wake Forest junior midfielder Corben Bone will find out on Jan. 8 if he is the winner of the prestigious 2009 Missouri Athletic Club Hermann Trophy. Bone is one of three finalists for the honor, which will be presented in St. Louis at the Missouri Athletic Club.

Andre Akpan of Harvard and Teal Bunbury of Akron are also contenders. The three finalists were chosen

out of a group of 15 semifinalists.

A native of Plano, Texas, Bone is looking to become the second straight Wake Forest player to claim the award. Last year, the Deacs had two of three finalists, including Marcus Tracy, who became the first Wake player to win the award. Sam Cronin was also a finalist.

The 2009 Atlantic Coast Conference Offensive Player of the Year, Bone has

scored two goals and added 13 assists during his junior season. Bone ranks eighth nationally in assists per game and is second in the ACC in helpers. Bone, who was named Top Drawer Soccer's National Player of the Year in 2009, has 38 assists in his career, ranking him second in school history. He also is in the top 10 in school annals in points with 66 career points.

Considered the highest individual honor in college soccer, the recipient of the Hermann Trophy is selected by Division I head coaches who are current members of the NSCAA.

with eight. He had 45 catches for 629 yards during the season.

Russell was Wake Forest's fifth-leading tackler in 2009 and tops among defensive linemen with 46

stops. He led the Deacons with eight tackles for loss and 4.5 sacks. Russell was previously named a second team All-ACC pick by the Atlantic Coast Sports Media Association.
