

First batch of nurses complete Baptist's ED Academy

Two years ago when the Emergency Department at Wake Forest University Baptist Medical Center had 25 open nursing positions and no applicants, officials knew something had to be done.

Thus, the ED Academy was born in July of 2009, with 10 new nursing graduates who applied to the six-

month training program. All 10 are female with some coming to nursing as a second career; two of them began at Wake Forest Baptist as nurse assistants.

The intensive program is structured to be a part of the regular ED orientation program so that participants don't have to gain the addition-

barrier for ED nurses. It amounts to a \$40,000 investment in each person when all the specialty certifications and education are totaled.
