E-Girls' vision is to provide a safe, non-judgmental and caring environment for every girl within the community. To help aid each girl in their positive growth and development,

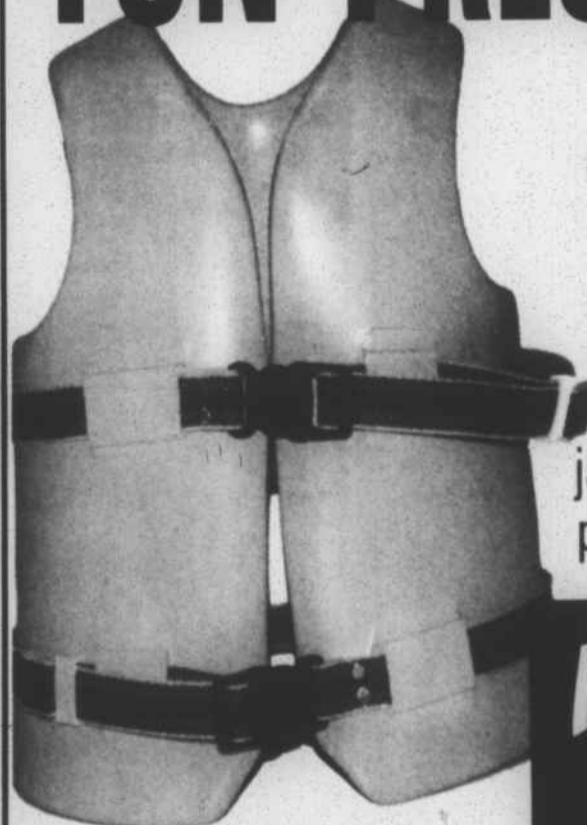
