He was called into ministry and was ordained an elder under the body of

United Bible Way Churches of Christ in 1975. In 1981, he opened a storefront church on Waughtown Street, which he named Calvary Hill Apostolic United Bible Way Church. It did not take long for the church's membership to outgrow the small space. God blessed the church' with a larger building in October 1982, when it relocated to 2411 Urban St. The church later received its charter.

In July 1996, Turner was ordained a bishop by the late Bishop Alonso McCloud, pastor of Tabernacle of Faith, and Rev. Lula Williams, pastor of Hartland A.M.E Church of Morganton. After his ordination, Turner renamed his

church Calvary Hill Church Of Greater Deliverance, Inc. A year later, the church moved to its present location on Manning Street.

Bishop Turner is married to the former Virginia M. Williams, an ordained minister who serves alongside her husband.
