Events to honor late wife and mother

A benefit concert featuring The Napper Singers will be held on Sunday, Aug. 26 at 4 p.m. to benefit the Terri B. Cole Foundation.

The non-profit organization was founded in 2011 by Rosemary Napper, the sister of Terri B. Cole, who was diagnosed with ovarian cancer in 2009 and died after a two year battle with the disease. Cole was a wife, mother of two and an active member of New Calvary Missionary Baptist Church.

The Foundation works to educate women as well as the community at large about the signs and symptoms of ovarian cancer. There are few early detection tests for ovarian cancer, so more than 80 percent of women are diagnosed in later stages, when their chances of survival are significantly

lower.

The Foundation, which believes that "No One Fights Alone," also provides financial assistance to women and families affected by this disease and partners with other local community organizations to raise awareness about this silent killer. The Foundation has gotten involved in the fight by hosting two Zumba benefits, a raffle and providing financial assistance to a 78-year old female who had been diagnosed with cancer. It will hold the 2012 Terry's Walk for the Cure on Saturday, Sept. 22 at 9 a.m. The three-mile walk will begin at the Marketplace Mall. The registration fee is \$10.
