CNN reports on voting revival

A few days before this month's general election took place, CNN paid a visit to Winston-Salem as part of a series of reports detailing voter outreach efforts in swing states. One of the stops made by CNN associate producer/ reporter Jordan Malter was at Union Baptist Church to detail the church's "Get Out & Vote Revival," which fea-tured the Rev. Dr. William Barber, the head of the N.C. NAACP and Dr. John head of the N.C. NAACP, and Dr. John Mendez, pastor of Emmanuel Baptist Church.

Dr. Sir Walter Mack Jr., the pastor of Union, escorted Malter to several local sites - including a barbershop, restaurant and early voting sites - so that the producer could interview local people.

The piece aired on CNN on Nov. 5. Union Baptist held the Get Out & Vote Revival from Oct. 3-4. In addition to speeches by Barber and Mendez, the "Pastors, Politicians and Community Leaders Luncheon" was held with guest speaker Mayor Allen Joines.

The revival was a non-partisan program designed to encourage individuals to exercise their right to vote and to provide information to help voters make knowledgeable deci-sions. Voter registration and polling information and an oppor-tunity to meet the candidates were also included in the pro-




