A collection of DVDs featuring interviews with sit-in activist Car
Matthews and Coach Clarence "Big House" Gaines and other loca black history legends has been donated to the Malloy Jordan Eas Winston Heritage Center Karim Allah Sharif and a few photos to library officials on Wednesday. Feb. 26, after screening some of the DVDs and discussing hem with an audience of about a dozen.
