Distinguished alumni Angus MacLachlan and J.T. Rogers will return to the University of North Carolina School of the Arts (UNCSCA) as participants in the three-part 50th Anniversary Speaker Series which focuses on the school's rich, but overlooked literary heritage. Part two of the series is at 7 p.m. on Sunday, Jan. 18 in Freedman Theatre on the UNCSCA campus, 1533 South Main St. Admission is free.

MacLachlan's work includes "Goodbye to all That," now playing in select theaters and available on Video on Demand, iTunes and Amazon. Set and filmed in Winston-Salem, the film stars UNCSCA alumnus Paul Schneider and features alumnae Anna Camp,

Celia Weston and Beth Bostic. MacLachlan also wrote the films "Junebug" and "Stone."

Rogers has written the plays "The Overwhelming" (selected as a Top Ten Play by Time magazine), "Madagascar" and "Murmuring in a Dead Tongue," as well as the screenplay for "Tokyo Vice," which is currently in development.

Both graduated from the School of Drama and have been granted hon-

orary doctorates from the School of the Arts. They will give readings and talk about their work, followed by a question-and-answer session.

Part one of the Speaker Series focused on six faculty members whose works include prose, novels-in-progress, poetry and non-fiction. The third and final installment, scheduled for March 22, will feature Chancellor Lindsay Bierman and Chancellor Emeritus Alex Ewing.
