WILKES HAS NEW CONCRETE BRIDGE

Will Begin Another Over Cub Creek at Once; Moonshiners Busy

North Wilkesboro, Jan. 26.—Mr. C. W. Craven, who has the contracts for building several bridges in Wilkes, has just turned over to the county commissioners for their inspection a modern bridge with concrete abutments and steel spans built over Moravian creek, about one mile above Wilkesboro.

Mr. Craven will commence at once to build a bridge of the same type over Cub creek just in the edge of Wilkesboro. This is to be built at a much needed point. At this point it is a very difficult task to build a bridge which will stand for any length of time.

Zebulon Weaver, Mrs. Thomas W. Lingle, Hon. J. Y. Joyner, Rev. Neal L. Anderson, C. L. Coon, Miss Eunice Sinclair, Rev. R. P. Smith and Wiley H. Swift. Speakers from South Carolina, Alabama, Georgia, and Mississippi have also been invited and special attention will be devoted to the discussion of the effects of child labor on education, social standards, the church, the community, women's clubs, industry and juvenile delinquency, with special reference to local conditions. At another session there will be an address on "Attempted Child Labor Legislation in North Carolina," and at another, one on "Mountains and Cotton Mills."
