All persons who have not now filed All persons who have not now flood their questionnaires with the Local Exemption Boak's are placed in Class !. In order for them to get their case considered for any defarred classification, they will have to appear before the board and offer convincing proof that the failure to file the questionnaire has been no fau t of theirs. All registrants who have failed to file questionnaires and who fail to offer 1318 such proof before Wednesday, Jan- 1336 uary 23, will be brought before the 1348 board by police or other officers whose cuty it is to bring delinquents before the board to be dealt with as Selective Service Regulations provide. In case registrant's neglect of his duty is found to be willful the Selective Service Law requires that he be turned over to the Federal authorities for prosecution

The Local Board has taken great pains to get registrants to properly fill out their questionnaires and the Legal Advisory Board and members of the legal profession have rendered much aid to registrants in preparing questionnaires.

There seems to be no reason why all the questionnair is should not have heen in by this time, with the possible exception of a few who may have been seriously ill or in some way unavoidably prevented, in which case it would be reasonable to expect that some friend or relative would inform the beautiful and a case.
