



The members of the Woman's Club who were present on yesterday Club who were present on yesterday at the open meeting to hear Dr. E. ('Eranson speak upon the subject of "Civic Housekeeping" enjoyed a ware opportunity to hear the facts concerning a subject that should be of the createst interest to every wo-man who loves humanity, or her weighbor.

Dr. Branson paid a most gallant tribute to women, saying that many trightful conditions within our state trightful conditions within our state wear continually from bad to wrse, until the wmen of the site awooke to the fact and began to realize the situation, saying that men were eith-er too busy after building wonder-ful eithes and institutions, or else lacked the discriminator neght nto the modus operandi of civic clean-liness—for these reasons or for some other, good housekeeping had ever been relegated to the women, and it was so in public as in mrivate it was so in public as in private bouscheeping. Dr. Branson said that in many counties there were no provisions for taking care of tubercu-lar patients, that Wake county alone had twice as many patients afflicted with the dred disease as there were fields in the sanitarium.
